Travel along the road with Jack Dempsey, Gene Tunney, Tommy Loughran, Max Baer, Max Schmelling and Jack Sharkey, while investigating pre-World War II American society.

Research Projects

Investigative topics on local and regional boxers and family history. Have a boxer in your past? This includes researching primary sources, conducting oral histories, "adopt-a-boxer" from the past for investigation, or developing statistical databases or websites.
